God of the Weather 🗲

The forest bows only to the weather; Tāne Mahuta is joined by Tāwhirimātea as the second disc in the Bros for Change x RPM Discs Atua Series.

Designing Tawhirimatea

The haehae designs following the edges of the stamp design are symbolic of ngā hau e whā (the four winds) of which Tāwhirimātea has dominion over by harnessing said winds and releasing them at his whim. Tāwhirimātea is symbolised here with four arms and four hands, again strengthening the connection to ngā hau e whā and his ability to harness all four winds. In this design Tāwhirimātea is also depicted as blind, tying into the Matariki narrative where Tāwhiri was defeated in single combat by his brother Tūmatauenga (The God of War and Mankind). After the battle, in his rage, Tāwhirimātea clawed his eyeballs out and crushed them within his hands. He then tossed them into the sky where they became the cluster of stars known as Matariki - "Ngā mata o te ariki Tāwhirimātea"



There is only one bird when I think of the weather and the winds and that is the Kāhu: The way it rides the wind and the speed really connects to Tāwhirimateā.

On the 21st of June, Tāwhirimātea, the Māori God of the Weather, will join Tāne Mahuta as the second disc of the Atua Series. Only 601 will be available for purchase and are produced in the mold of our RPM Kāhu XG. These discs are exclusively coloured in different shades of beautiful blue.

After a long winter break it took a few events to shake off the rust, and so with this event I was happy to finally play 2 really clean rounds in a row!

My drives were mostly on point and I was able to capitalize on a lot of them getting 22 birdies out of 36 holes!

The biggest highlight of the event was stepping up to any putt and knowing my Ruru was going to find the basket, definitely was my best putting performance (83% C1X) at an event!

Most challenging thing was just staying calm and focused throughout the event, andremembering to have fun! Positive cards both rounds definitely helped with that though.

My Rurus were definitely the discs I reached for the most, Magma on the putting green and Atomic off the tee! My Kiwi also put in a ton of work, snagging me at least 5 birdies! This was my first event with the Tara Iti, although it didn't get much use as I'm still working it into my bag. It definitely will be a staple going forward!

My favorite hole was probably hole #17: A very wooded par 4 with the basket elevated in a forked tree. In round two I had a 45ft putt sneak through the fork of the tree and drop in to save par!

With this being my first season playing MPO it feels great to already claim a win! Hopefully will be the first of many. My game is the best it's ever been and still improving, very exited for the rest of the season!

My overall experience at the Crossover Open 5 Ams was an incredible one to say the least. From the mental battle of a three round event, to the relief of finally holding my first MA2 trophy at the end of it, will make this event something I'll truly never forget!

My highlight moment competing was in round one, where I was able to attain a 4 stroke lead on my competition while also shooting by far my best round ever at William Harbin Park with a -8. This round gave me the momentum I needed carrying over into the second and third rounds and maintain my lead.

My most challenging moment this weekend was definitely in the third round. We played our first 6 holes before we were cut short by a 45 minute rain delay. Coming off of the delay, I had a few rough holes and had to put myself back in the mindset I was in for the first two rounds before I let things get away from me. Fortunately I was able to do this and stay the course!

My go to RPM disc for any tournament is my atomic kea, for buttery smooth forehand upshot's inside of 230 ft, this disc is my true workhorse. On my 5 hole birdie stretch in the first round, three of them were attained off the tee with my Kea.

My favorite hole in this tournament was hole 17 in the first round. I was coming off of 4 birdies straight, generally more getable holes, and coming into 17 I figured my birdie stretch would be over, it's a tougher hole, but I was able to hyzer flip my atomic Pekapeka to about 20 ft, then knocked down the putt for a bonus birdie!

The Crossover Crew has really become a sort of second family to me in the disc golf scene. Being a part of something bigger and getting to meet great people while doing it, they are the winners for putting countless hours into hosting these wonderful events for us, thanks guys!
